

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - 15 minutes before all Weekday Masses, as well as 3:30 p.m. on Saturday; or by appointment with the priest.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

Saint of the Week

St. Louis Mary Grignion design Montfort (April 28) He was a French Roman Catholic priest and confessor, known in his time as a preacher and was made a missionary apostolic by Pope Clement XI. Aside from preaching, he found time to write a number of books which became classic catholic titles and his writings influenced several popes.

St. Louis is known for his particular devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary and also for the practice of praying the Holy Rosary. He is considered as one of the important writers in the field of Mariology. His most notable works related to Marian devotion are contained in the "Secrets of Mary" and the "True Devotion to Mary". The Church, under the pontificate of Pope Pius XII, canonized St. Louis on July 20, 1947.
