

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday – 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays – 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

PASTORAL COUNCIL's Mission, Objectives and Roles

Parish Pastoral Council membership is a form of community service. Positions within the council indicate specific responsibilities that parishioners willingly commit themselves to having better opportunities to do ministry. Meanwhile, the nomination process indicates the free selection by participating community members and not a candidacy of person/s to any position of honor or power.

1. It is the primary **leadership grouping, called from the parish community**, to share with the Pastor to build up the body of Christ and to be concerned with the overall welfare of the parish family.

2. It is a *consultative body* that **shares the responsibility** of <u>proclaiming the Word of</u> <u>God</u>, <u>building</u>, and <u>strengthening the Church</u> <u>Community</u>, <u>praying</u> (*personally and collectively*), and <u>serving</u> others in charity.

3. To **discern** the spiritual and material needs of the parish community and **to plan, organize, and initiate** the implementation of structures required to fulfill these needs.

4. To work for a just society with other churches and organizations in the neighborhood and the broader community, in particular: (a) To be concerned with all the pastoral aspects of parish life, ensuring that parishioners are served well by the Parish and have meaningful opportunities to contribute to the parish ministries; (b) To consult with parishioners and parish groups and then represent them effectively in deliberations and decision-making that generally affect parish life. <u>a</u>dvice (c) provide *consultative* to the Pastor and help in identifying goals and setting up policies for the Parish while defining the means to achieve these goals; (d) monitor and evaluate the work of the various committees and ministries of the Parish, without becoming involved in the dayto-day details, and to act together as a council for the betterment of the Parish

From the PASTOR's 0779CE

On the **Second Sunday of Easter**, some parishioners and I went on a pilgrimage to the National Shrine of the Divine Mercy at Stockbridge, Massachusetts. We joined many Catholics in praying for the Church on its journey toward holiness. During our travels, we sought to be united with every parishioner who stayed back through prayers of intercessions and devotions (rosary and chaplet of the Divine Mercy) for everyone's well-being and intentions.

On this day, the **Third Sunday of Easter**, we shall *meditate* on the disciples' joy as they recognized Jesus, our Lord, when he broke the Bread with them (LUKE 24:13-35). We *commit to memory* that we are ransomed by the precious blood of Christ, who is the Lamb of God (1 PETER 1:17-21), so our *hearts rejoice* with the Psalmist says: *"Lord, you will show me the path of life"* (PSALM.16:11).

As a faith community, we unite ourselves continually in prayers, many acts of devotion, and even when we endure bodily pains and sufferings. The <u>spiritual strength that enables us</u> to do so has its source in the WORD of GOD proclaimed (at *Mass and in our reading at home or with a group.* Like the disciples in the Gospel: "Were not our hearts burning with us while he... was opening the Scripture for us?"

This ardent yearning for GOD in each of us comes from our heart through that inner voice that the Creator gifted us with, an internal compass that directs us to seek the only GOOD, the absolute TRUTH, and the most sublime BEAUTY.

Where must this path of life lead us? In the celebration of the Liturgy, especially in the Holy Eucharist! This sacred time of encounter with the Redeemer in WORDS of the SCRIPTURE and the SACRAMENT --- a meeting on earth culminating in our being with HIM in eternal bliss.
