

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - 15 minutes before all Weekday Masses, as well as 3:30 p.m. on Saturday; or by appointment with the priest.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - by appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

The Lord is Risen, Alleluia!

The Gospel this Sunday, the 3rd of Easter, brings us to the story of the Road to Emmaus. It invites us to walk along with the two disciples to encounter the Risen Lord. It invites us to go into the shoes of His disciples. They were downcast, confused, disappointed with what had happened lately in Jerusalem concerning Jesus. Losing their hope regarding the coming of their Saviour and rRdeemer. Somehow, because of what the world is experiencing now, we are in a similar situation, downcast, distressed, and confused. The uncertainty of tomorrow brings anxiety. We search for an answer and assurance, but we cannot find one. We are blinded by our own prejudice, the prejudice of the world.

Jesus wants to walk with us as He did with the two disciples on their way to Emmaus. The road of uncertainty was transformed by Jesus into the road that leads to hope. Our Emmaus can lead us also into an encounter with the Lord. If we listen to Jesus, in the Holy Scripture, His living word, then the eyes of our faith will be opened and we will recognize Him I the breaking of the bread (Holy Sacrifice of the Mass).
