

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday - 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays - 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.



A guide to the 5th Sunday Readings

To understand the FIRST READING selection this weekend (Acts 9:26-31), one should read first *Acts 9:1-25.* It is also fruitful to remember that whereas the previous weeks have focused on understanding the meaning of the Easter events and developing ideas about JESUS, the FATHER, and the early community, the readings this week issue a call to action: we ought to be fruitful! It is important to know the content of our Faith, but it is essential that we abide by it and bear much fruit.

Related to the above is the central theme of the SECOND READING (1 John 3:18-24), which is about how love functions in the community's life. Love must be actively expressed in deeds and not just in words. More importantly, this command to love begins with one's belief in JESUS and imitating His love, meaning loving one another as Jesus loved us.

In the GOSPEL, Jesus said: "I AM THE VINE." At the same time. we are the branches that should remain connected to the vine. Through Baptism. each of us was joined to Jesus by the Holy Spirit. As a branch grows from a tree, our souls are to draw life from Him, nourished by the Word from the Scripture and the Eucharist, and made strong by the Father as the vine-grower who cared for the fruitfulness of the vine. God will "prune" us — as a gardener trims and cuts back a plant so that it will grow stronger and bear even more fruit. Are you suffering or undergoing trials? Remember that our struggles are the pruning, by which we are disciplined and trained so that we can grow in holiness and bear fruits of righteousness. REMAIN IN THE LORD, TRUST!
