

# **PASTORAL CARE**

**BAPTISMS** - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

**CONFESSIONS** - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday – 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays – 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

**MARRIAGES** - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

**SPIRITUAL COUNSELING -** By appointment.

# The Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The **Blessed Virgin Mary's queenship** has roots in Scripture. <u>At the Annunciation</u>, Gabriel announced that Mary's Son would receive the throne of David and rule forever. <u>At the Visitation</u>, Elizabeth calls Mary "mother of my Lord." As in all the mysteries of Mary's life, she is closely associated with Jesus: *Her queenship is a share in Jesus' kingship. We can also recall that in the Old Testament the mother of the king has great influence in court.* 

In the **4<sup>th</sup> century** Saint Ephrem called Mary "Lady" and "Queen." Later Church fathers and doctors continued to use the title. Hymns of the **11th to 13th centuries** address Mary as queen: *"Hail, Holy Queen," "Hail, Queen of Heaven," "Queen of Heaven."* The Dominican rosary and the Franciscan crown as well as numerous invocations in Mary's litany celebrate her queenship.

Queen of Heaven (*Regina Caeli in Latin*) is one of many Queen titles used of Mary, mother of Jesus. <u>The title derived in part from the ancient</u> <u>Catholic teaching that Mary, at the end of her</u> <u>earthly life, was bodily and</u> <u>spiritually assumed into heaven, (ASSUMPTION)</u> <u>and that she is there honored as Queen</u> (Otto, John, ed., *Dictionary of Mary*. New York: Catholic Book Publishing Co. pp. 283–284).

Pius XII explained on the theological reasons for her title of Queen in a radio message to Fatima of May 13, 1946: *He, the Son of God, reflects on His heavenly Mother the glory, the majesty and the dominion of His kingship, for, having been associated to the King of Martyrs in the ... work of human Redemption as Mother and cooperator, she remains forever associated to Him, with a practically unlimited power, in the distribution of the graces which flow from the Redemption. Jesus is King throughout all eternity by nature and by right of conquest: through Him, with Him, and subordinate to Him, Mary is Queen by grace, by divine relationship, by right of conquest, and by singular choice [of the Father].*  Liturgical Publications 3171 LENWORTH DR. #12 MISSISSAUGA, ON L4X 2G6 1-800-268-2637
