

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

Featured Saint of the Week

Saints Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus (August 31) Joseph was a respected, wealthy civic leader who had become a disciple of Jesus. Following the death of Jesus, Joseph obtained Jesus' body from Pilate, wrapped it in fine linen and buried it. For these reasons, Joseph is considered the patron saint of funeral directors and pallbearers. More important is the courage Joseph showed in asking Pilate for Jesus' body. Jesus was a condemned criminal who had been publicly executed. According to some legends, Joseph was punished and imprisoned for such a bold act.

Nicodemus was a Pharisee and, like Joseph, an important firstcentury Jew. We know from John's Gospel that Nicodemus went to Jesus at night—secretly—to better understand his teachings about the kingdom. Later, he spoke up for Jesus at the time of his arrest and assisted in Jesus' burial. We know little else about Nicodemus.

<u>A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR</u>

Peace and Goodness!

In todays Gospel, Jesus invites us to listen to Him. In the Old Testament, we find the Israelites hearing God but not listening to Him. Even during the time of Jesus, the Pharisees failed to listen to God who sent Jesus, His only begotten Son. They were so engrossed with the externalities of observing the Law and failed to see the heart and spirit of the Law.

Today's readings remind us that we must be doers of the law and not just hearers of it, but we must also understand the spirit of the law. What we see externally should be deeply rooted in the highest law which is love (for God and neighbour).

Love is not an idea but an action of our own purpose in life. It must be expressed in Sacrifice which is the language of Love.

True and active participation in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is not by singing with our lips but singing by our lives, not responding with words from our mouth but responding by the love we put in our lives. It is when we sing with our lives and responding with love in our hearts that our singing and responding in words in the Liturgy becomes a true "partecipatio actuosa" (active participation).
