

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday – 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays – 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

Catechism of the Catholic Church: IBELIEVE IN JESUS CHRIST, THE ONLY SON OF GOD... <u>on the third day he rose again</u>

CCC 639 The mystery of Christ's resurrection is a real event, with manifestations that were historically verified, as the New Testament gives witness. In about A.D. 56 **St. Paul** could already write to the **Corinthians (15:3-4):** *"I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the Twelve…"* The Apostle speaks here of the living tradition of the Resurrection which he had learned after his conversion at the gates of Damascus.

CCC 647 (selection). Although the Resurrection was an historical event that could be verified by the sign of the empty tomb and by the reality of the apostles' encounters with the risen Christ, still <u>it</u> remains at the very heart of the mystery of faith as something that transcends and surpasses history. This is why the risen Christ does not reveal himself to the world, but to his disciples, "to those who came up with him from Galilee to Jerusalem, who are now his witnesses to the people" (Acts 13:31; cf. John 14:22).

CCC 648-649 (selection). In the Resurrection the three divine persons act together as one, and manifest their own proper characteristics. The Father's power "raised up" Christ his Son Jesus who is conclusively revealed as "Son of God in power according to the Spirit of holiness by his (Rom 1:3-4: Resurrection from the dead" cf. Acts 2:24). St. Paul insists on the manifestation of God's power through the working of the Spirit who gave life to Jesus' dead humanity and called it to the glorious state of Lordship (Cf. Rom 6:4; 2 Cor 13:4; Phil 3:10; Eph 1:19-22; Heb 7:16). Jesus' effect his own Resurrection by virtue of his divine power. Jesus announces that the Son of man will have to suffer much, die, and then rise. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again." (Jn 10:17-18)."We believe that Jesus died and rose again." (1 Thess 4:14).

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
