

# PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

**CONFESSIONS** - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday - 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays - 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

#### **SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -**

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

## COLLECTION OF SOX, MITTS AND HATS:

With the cold weather upon us, it is time again to collect sox, mitts, scarves and hats for the homeless to keep them warm. Baskets will be placed at both entrances of our Church. Your donations will be greatly appreciated.

PLENARY INDULGENCE on the Occasion of the 8<sup>th</sup> Centenary of the CHRISTMAS as experienced by Saint Francis of Assisi: All Catholics can receive a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions from December 8, 2023, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, to February 2, 2024, the Feast of the Presentation in the Temple of Our Lord Jesus Christ, by visiting Assumption Parish and in any other churches pastorally managed by the Franciscan families throughout the world and stopping in prayer in front of the nativity scenes. Likewise, those who are sick can equally benefit from the gift of the plenary indulgence, offering their sufferings to the Lord or carrying out practices of piety."

WHAT ARE THE USUAL CONDITIONS? To gain a plenary indulgence, upon performing the charitable work or praying the aspiration or prayer for which the indulgence is granted, one must fulfill the prescribed conditions of: (1) a complete and whole-hearted detachment from all sin of any kind, even venial sin by going to sacramental CONFESSION, (2) participating actively at in a MASS, (3) prayer for the intentions of the Pope.

What is PIETY? It an outward sign of an interior disposition of giving filial worship to our Father in heaven, showing reverence to God and respecting others as brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ. What are some examples of CATHOLIC PRACTICES OF PIETY --- Bowing our heads at the Sacred Name of Jesus (see Philippians 2.5-11), making the Sign of the Cross over our hearts or foreheads when we pass by a Catholic Church where Jesus is truly in the Blessed Sacrament, and making reparation whenever we hear the Holy Name of Jesus uttered blasphemously.

**NOTE:** The Church prepares for CHRISTMAS, not until December 17 (one week before Christmas Eve). Our parish community wishes to do this through the traditional SIMBANG GABI celebrations starting with a **Mass at 7:00 PM on December 15** (Friday), continuing with the Novena Masses (Dec. 16 & 23 – 4:00 PM; Dec. 17-22 at 7:00 PM)

# From the Pastor's Office ADVENT SEASON

During the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Weeks of Advent Season, the readings at Mass highlight the Second Coming of the Lord Jesus Christ more than the Incarnation.

Last Sunday's Second reading, we reflected on our relationship with *God our Father*, who, as St. Paul wrote, is the source of *"Grace to you and peace"* (cf. 1 Corinthians 1:3). This truth was reinforced for us this Season at the SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY, in particular, in its 1<sup>st</sup> Reading (Genesis 3:9-15, 20):

(1) God <u>punished every evil action</u> and <u>made</u> <u>clear the result of distrust and disobedience</u>, which is our struggle against sinfulness (Genesis 3:14, 16-18).

(2) <u>At the same time, God gives hope towards</u> <u>peace</u> --- Adam's companion, "the woman," was given a name, "EVE" – mother of all the living! She who has sinned (together with Adam) will find salvation in "him" – in Jesus Christ (cf. Genesis 3:15).

This SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT, our 1<sup>st</sup> reading zeroes in on <u>PEACE</u> brought about by <u>God's faithful love</u>. We are His People; God is present and <u>nurtures us</u> (cf. Isaiah 40: 1, 10-11). We ought to live in peace as we listen to the voice that prepares the LORD's way (cf. Isaiah 40:3).

What does it mean to live in PEACE? The 2<sup>nd</sup> reading reminds us to lead a holy and exemplary life **(cf. 2 Peter 3:11)** --- **daily**, we are to follow the Lord's teachings, deepening our relationship with God and our brothers and sisters. So that, as in the Gospel, like John the Baptist, we can witness Jesus coming again because it was by water and the Holy Spirit and through Him that we are sons and daughters of the GOD OUR **(cf. Mark 1:8)**.
