

### **PASTORAL CARE**

**BAPTISMS** - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

**CONFESSIONS** - By appointment only.

**MARRIAGES** - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

# Featured Saint of the Week

Blessed Mary Frances Schervier

Born into a distinguished family in Aachen—Frances ran the household after her mother's death, and established a reputation for generosity to the poor. In 1844, she became a Secular Franciscan. The next year she and four companions established a religious community devoted to caring for the poor. In 1851, the Sisters of the Poor of St. Francis were approved by the local bishop; the community soon spread. When Mother Frances died, there were 2,500 members of her community worldwide. They are still engaged in operating hospitals and homes for the aged. Mother Mary Frances was beatified in 1974.

## <u>A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR</u>

Rejoice for the Lord's coming is near!

As we join the Church in rejoicing as the Lord's coming is near, the Gospel brings us to a point where we are asked to choose to repent and not to repent. John's voice that cries out in the wilderness echoes into our hearts and ask us to make a radical choice: to turn away from sin and return to God or to remain in our enslavement to sin.

The Solemnity of Mary's Immaculate Conception shines as the victory of God's love. Mary was preserved from the stain of sin in view of the Lord's coming through her and also in view of our coming back to God. She is the mother of Jesus and the mother of the Church, the mystical body of Christ. The marriage between the God to His people is sealed by the Incarnation of Christ. His Divine nature cannot be anymore separated from His Human nature.

Mary already gave her "fiat" to God: "Be it done to me according to your word". We are now asked to say our "fiat" to God. To seal God's covenant in us and to make us part of the Church, the Bride of Christ.

And as people betrothed to God, we are like the virgins in the Gospel, waiting for the coming of the Bridegroom, who is Christ. Vigilant and with our lamps lit, we await the coming of the Lord.

We cry out as we wait: Maranatha, Lord Jesus come. Hasten your coming.
