

## **PASTORAL CARE**

**BAPTISMS** - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

**CONFESSIONS** - By appointment only.

**MARRIAGES** - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

**SPIRITUAL COUNSELING -** By appointment.

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

### <u>MESSAGE TO ALL THE CLERGY AND THE</u> FAITHFUL OF THE ARCHDIOCESE OF OTTAWA-CORNWALL

Dec. 4, 2020

As announced by the Holy See today, I am assuming the pastoral governance of the Archdiocese of Ottawa-Cornwall as your Metropolitan Archbishop. This news comes as no surprise to you, but it is important, I believe, to note this transition of power. In succeeding His Grace Archbishop Prendergast, I inherit a diocesan Church that is both young because it is newly created, but also rich in history, culture and traditions. The greatest treasure is to be found first of all in each of the persons who make up our living Church because we find God's gift in each of them. I am convinced that the power of the Holy Spirit will guide and equip us for the mission that must expand in this unique time in our history.

## <u>Featured Saint of the Week</u> Blessed Honoratus Kozminski (December 16)

Wenceslaus Kozminski was born in Biala Podlaska in 1829. By the age of 11 he had lost his faith. By the age of 16 his father had died. He studied architecture at the School of Fine Arts in Warsaw. Suspected of participating in a rebellious conspiracy against the Czarists in Poland, he was imprisoned from April 1846 until March of 1847. His life then took a turn for the better, and in 1848 he received the Capuchin habit and a new name, Honoratus. He was ordained in 1855 and dedicated his energies to the ministry where he was involved, among other things, with the Secular Franciscan Order.

Father Honoratus died on December 16, 1916, and was beatified in 1988.

## <u>A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR</u>
