

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - 15 minutes before all Weekday Masses, as well as 3:30 p.m. on Saturday; or by appointment with the priest.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. John Damascene, Priest and Doctor of the Church (Dec. 4)

Born in Damascus, St. John (675-749) served as finance minister to the caliph before his ordination. He dedicated himself to study and writing, producing both works of dogmatic theology as well as many hymns. One of the principal defenders of the use of images in religious worship, he is considered the last Father of the Church.

A Message from Your Pastor

Maranatha, Lord Jesus, Come!

Dear brothers and sisters, today, we begin the new liturgical year. Today's Gospel presents to us symbols that we see in the creation of the world, in the book of Genesis. The season of Advent highlights the three-fold coming of Jesus: in the past: incarnation, at present: Eucharist, and in the future: the Parousia. All coming of Jesus is a re-creation, a rebirth in the love of the Lord.
