

# PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

**CONFESSIONS** - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday - 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays - 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

#### **SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -**

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

**COLLECTION OF SOX, MITTS AND HATS:** With the cold weather upon us, it is time again to collect sox, mitts, scarves and hats for the homeless to keep them warm. Baskets will be placed at both entrances of our Church, your donations which will be greatly appreciated.

PLENARY INDULGENCE on the Occasion of the 8<sup>th</sup> Centenary of the CHRISTMAS as experienced by Saint Francis of Assisi: All Catholics can receive a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions from December 8, 2023, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, to February 2, 2024, the Feast of the Presentation in the Temple of Our Lord Jesus Christ, by visiting Assumption Parish and in any other churches pastorally managed by the Franciscan families throughout the world and stopping in prayer in front of the nativity scenes. Likewise, those who are sick can equally benefit from the gift of the plenary indulgence, offering their sufferings to the Lord or carrying out practices of piety."

WHAT ARE THE USUAL CONDITIONS? To gain a plenary indulgence, upon performing the charitable work or praying the aspiration or prayer for which the indulgence is granted, one must fulfill the prescribed conditions of: (1) a complete and whole-hearted detachment from all sin of any kind, even venial sin by going to sacramental CONFESSION, (2) participating actively at in a MASS, (3) prayer for the intentions of the Pope.

What is PIETY? It an outward sign of an interior disposition of giving filial worship to God our Father and to treat all people as children of the same Father --- meaning, showing reverence for God as a loving Father, and respects others as children of God.

What are some examples of **CATHOLIC PRACTICES OF PIETY** --- Bowing our heads at the Sacred Name of Jesus (see Philippians 2.5-11), making the Sign of the Cross over our hearts or foreheads when we pass by a Catholic Church where Jesus is truly in the Blessed Sacrament, and making reparation whenever we hear the Holy Name of Jesus uttered blasphemously.

# From the Pastor's Office ADVENT SEASON

Many Catholics think that the season of Advent is a preparation for Christmas, but a quick look at the prayers and readings at Mass in these initial days of Advent and the coming weeks shows that it is about the Second Coming of the Lord Jesus Christ (not to Christmas).

This **FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT**, we have in our FIRST READING an emphasis on *God as Father*, that is, the chosen people **(Isaiah 63:16b)**. It also recalls God's providential care, but the people turned away. Meanwhile, the SECOND READING signified a return to grace. St. Paul prays for the fullness of GOD's blessing upon the community of Corinth: *"Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ"* **(1 Corinthians 1:3)**. Moreover, St. Paul offered thanks for the Father's goodness toward His People in the past and expressed trust in the Lord's continuing blessings in the future --- until His Second Coming.

A fitting response to this is highlighted in the GOSPEL: *Beware, keep alert; for you do not know when the time will come.*" (Mark 13:33). We ought to be on guard for the Coming of Jesus. We are entrusted with doing God's work through the fulfillment of our mission using the "talents" entrusted to us (*Gospel of November 19*) for the Lord will judge us according to our faithfulness (*Gospel of November 26*).

ARE YOU READY?

**NOTE:** The Church prepares for CHRISTMAS, not until December 17 (one week before Christmas Eve). Our parish community wishes to do this through the traditional SIMBANG GABI celebrations starting with a **Mass at 7:00 PM on December 15** (Friday), continuing with the Novena Masses (Dec. 16 & 23 – 4:00 PM; Dec. 17-22 at 7:00 PM)
