PLENARY INDULGENCE on the Occasion of the 8<sup>th</sup> Centenary of the CHRISTMAS as experienced by Saint Francis of Assisi

Who can gain this indulgence? <u>All Catholics</u> and <u>those who are sick</u>

**When?** From December 8, 2023, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, to February 2, 2024, the Feast of the Presentation in the Temple of Our Lord Jesus Christ

**Where?** At the ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY PARISH (Vanier) and in any other churches pastorally managed by the Franciscan families throughout the world

**How?** For those who are ill or home-bound can equally benefit from the gift of the plenary indulgence, by offering their sufferings to the Lord and carrying out practices of piety (kissing the Bible or the crucifix). Those who are well needs to fulfill the usual conditions of: (1) a whole-hearted detachment from sin of any kind by going to sacramental CONFESSION, (2) participating actively at in a MASS, (3) PRAYING IN FRONT OF THE NATIVITY SCENES for the intentions of the Pope with the invocations: Jesus, Mary and Joseph – have mercy on us AND St. Francis of Assisi – pray for us.



## CHRISTMAS SEASON

The season of CHRISTMAS celebrates the birth of the Lord Jesus and the ways he manifested **the presence of GOD in our midst**.

Last week, we highlighted **His presence** manifested in the birth of Jesus among us is the gift is the transformation of our lives which we must respond to God's invitation by <u>opening our hearts to Him with</u> gratitude and eagerness, following the example of Mary, our model in following God's plan.

We also saw testimonies of witnesses of Faith: (1) **St. Stephen** (Dec 26) He was "a martyr in will and deed" - Acts of the Apostles 6:7; (2) **St. John** the Evangelist (Dec 27) – gives witness to the joy and courage of those who have seen and lived with Jesus; **the Holy Innocents** (Dec 28) they were "martyrs in deed, though not in will," and their deaths are a reminder that suffering on behalf of a good cause is not always restricted to those who have a choice in the matter.

This weekend, we <u>first</u> celebrate the **Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph** (Dec 31). It continues its flight into Egypt and returns to Nazareth. The <u>second</u> is the **Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God** (Jan. 1), when we focus on the role of Mary in the birth of Jesus Christ. She is the "Theotokos," literally the God-bearer. She does not simply carry Jesus' human nature, nor is she a vessel for his divinity alone. Because Jesus' divine and human natures are united, she is truly the Mother of God.

**Christmas Octave** follows, this is when most people have time to rest from a busy year and spend time with their family. A fitting way to observe these days is to attend daily Mass and prayerfully reflect on the selection of Scripture readings: **Dec 26** – Acts of the Apostles 6:8-10, 7:54-59. **Dec 27** – First Letter of John 1:1-4 & Gospel according to John 20:2-8. **Dec 28** – First Letter of John 1:5-2:2 and Gospel according to Matthew 2:13-18. **Dec 31** – Ecclesiastes 3:2-6, 12-14. **Jan 1** – Numbers 6:22-27; Galatians 4:4-7 and Gospel according to Luke 2:16-21.
