

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

Featured Saint of the Week

<u>St. Ambrose, Bishop and Doctor of the Church (December 7)</u> While St. Ambrose (340-397) was serving the imperial government and yet a catechumen, he was elected Bishop of Milan. He distinguished himself through apostolic zeal, service to the poor, and effective care of the faithful. An articulate opponent of Arianism in the West, he converted and baptized St. Augustine.

<u>A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR</u> O come Divine Messiah!

In the Gospel today, John invites us to prepare the coming of the Lord. He leads us in preparing by proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. The promised salvation is coming, and it is already here among us but we have to follow the invitation of John to repentance. It is a calling for a change of heart.

It is not by chance that we celebrate the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception during this season, for Mary's Immaculate Heart shines as an example of the real birthplace of God. St. Augustine reminds us that even before Jesus entered her womb at the Annunciation, Jesus was already in the heart of Mary. She kept her heart pure and sinless as she awaits the coming of the Messiah. These two great figures (St. John the Baptist and the Blessed Virgin Mary) are highlighted as guides and paths that lead to our perfect union with God.

God is faithful and true to His promise. God never abandons His people. He came at the fulness of time as a little child born in the manger at Bethlehem. He will be coming back as He promised to unite us to the Father. And in between these two comings, He is coming in the Eucharist to sustain us on our pilgrimage on this earth. Let us be vigilant and prepare for His coming. Let us try our best to love God with all our heart and to love our neighbour as ourselves. And let us learn how to love from Jesus, our brother as we encounter Him in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.
