

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - Weekdays, after the 8am Morning Mass (approach the priest) First Fridays -8:45am to 9:15am First Saturdays - 9:30am to 10:00am, 3:30pm to 4:00pm (by appointment) Every Sunday - 11:30am to 12:00Noon

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

6th SUNDAY in Ordinary Time

Those who specialize in the study of the Bible tell us that the word BLESSED in Greek *makarios*, like the Hebrew word *'ashre,'* <u>does not confer</u> <u>blessing but recognizes an existing state of</u> <u>happiness inherent in God</u>. When we experience blessedness, it flows from our relationship with God, transforming our lives and filling us with hope. Meanwhile, BEING POOR or POVERTY is always regarded as evil in the Scripture. So, what is the meaning of Jesus' words, "<u>Blessed</u> <u>are you who are poor, for the Kingdom of God is</u> <u>yours.</u>"

JESUS invites all his followers to embrace some degree of being poor, but not destitution, as an essential aspect of all those who wish to commit to be his followers: "Foxes have dens and birds have nests, but the Son of Man has no place to lay his head." (MATTHEW 8:20); "Sell your possessions and give to the poor. Provide purses for yourselves that will not wear out, a treasure in heaven that will never fail, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (LUKE 12:33-34). When He speaks of the poor, he asks them to be instruments of blessings to the needy of which the early Church reiterates and bears witness: "Command them to do good, to be rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share" (1 Timothy 6:18); "If anyone has material possessions and sees a brother or sister in need but has no pity on them, how can the love of God be in that person? Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth." (1 John 3:17-18).

The **blessedness that JESUS holds up** is the happiness of those freed from a desperate situation of poverty, a state of being that is not just about material wealth but also about spiritual enlightenment and liberation, made possible by the compassionate and concrete love towards those who have less by those who have more.

Whoever oppresses the poor insults his Maker, but he who is generous to the needy honors him. (PROVERBS 14:31)

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
