

# PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

**CONFESSIONS** - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday - 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays - 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

**SPIRITUAL COUNSELING -** By appointment.

#### **SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -**

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

## WEEK ENDING COLLECTION REPORT February 11 & 12 - \$1,761.

**SNOW PLOWING EXPENSES.** The parish in under contract with Zagros Property Management, in the past we paid \$7,684 in 2021 and \$8,248 for 2020.

**2022 TAX RECEIPTS** The tax-deductible receipts are now available for pick-up at the main entrance of the Church.

**IMPORTANT REMINDER:** <u>Ash Wednesday is a</u> <u>day of Fasting and of abstinence from meat</u>. Christian fasting obtains its full meaning when we deprive ourselves of food in order to be more open to prayer, to share more in the suffering of those who are starving and to save money to give to the poor. Our fasting is a penitential discipline intended to open our hearts to God and to others, a means of purification and spiritual freedom, a witness of the depth of our Faith.

The law of <u>abstinence from meat</u> binds those who are 14 and older. The law of <u>fasting</u> binds from 18 to 59 years of age. *Exceptions are made for those who are taking medication or those who are sick.*

# From the PASTOR's 0779CE

Last week on the **6th Sunday of Ordinary Time**, we highlighted <u>God-given freedom to all</u> in choosing between blessings or woe (*Sirach 15:15* – 20). Concerning the Gospel (*Matthew 5:17-37*), Jesus' reminder that for God's faithful ones, the mere external observance of the Law is not enough but rather the mastery of one's passion and desires, managing one's emotions to do good and avoid evil is essential.

This 7th Sunday in Ordinary Time, we continue along that line of reflection to come to the sole purpose of it all. Consider, the FIRST READING (Leviticus 19:1-2, 17-18), God reminds us to take away anger in our hearts: "You shall not bear hatred for your brother or sister in your heart. Though you may have to reprove your fellow citizen, do not incur sin because of him." Instead, we must put on love: "Take no revenge and cherish no grudge against any of your people. You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Meanwhile, in the GOSPEL (Matthew 5:38-48), Jesus offers some concrete expressions of loving concern: "Give to the one who asks of you, and does not turn your back on one who wants to borrow." Also, "love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father, for he makes his sun rise on the bad and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust.

Ultimately, it is this ---- Our freedom, if we use it guided by the wisdom of God, will lead us to achieve God's intent for us which is wholeness and regaining that original goodness of which we are at the beginning of Time.

"Be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect."
