

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

7th Sunday in Ordinary Time

All of the Scriptures testify that God, our Father, abundantly showers us with compassion, pardon, and love in his providence and care. This overflowing abundance of mercy is a constant reassurance of his love for us. How, then, can we respond to God's mercy? By emulating the Divine Giver whose child we are.

In our GOSPEL this Sunday, Jesus spells out some ways: Loving enemies, doing good to those who do hateful things, blessing those who speak abusively, and praying for such people. Also, in the FIRST READING, we have an example of how not to return evil for evil. David chooses not to harm Saul, even though the king has made it difficult for him and has been trying to take his life away. "Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful." (Luke 6:26)

Jesus invites all those who follow Him to a fundamental stance in life that must be chosen so that we reflect the image of GOD, our Creator. It is possible only when we continually open ourselves the Father's immeasurable to goodness, compassion, and love. The more we become conscious of how blessed we are, the more our capacity for loving others increases. It also demands that we challenge our instinct to retaliate when faced with danger instinctively --for example, when someone speaks unkindly of us, our urge is to return it with equally hurtful (sometimes more spiteful words). This challenge calls for introspection and a conscious effort to respond with love and mercy.

Our Savior points out that when evil is returned for evil, it only increases the measure of evil around us. The best way is to remain in God's grace and return evil acts with good deeds, with the strength and conviction not from our own but of the Holy Spirit already in us --- given in Baptism and Confirmation. This guidance from the Holy Spirit empowers us to act with mercy and love, even in the face of adversity.

GOD's mercy towards us must shape and direct our ability to be merciful to others, too.
