

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday – 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays – 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

We welcome new members and visitors to our parish. Thank you for praying with us and for helping build a Christian community.

From the PASTOR's 0779CE

Recently, this office received an email from a parishioner at the request of her friend to **encourage all the community members to pray the Rosary daily for PEACE IN THE WORLD**. "In particular, the sender shared her concern that "the war in Ukraine can turn into a world war since others nations are sending tanks, etc." "Prayer is the only answer."

I wonder, **do parishioners realize that this community was constantly praying for worldwide peace** --- end of war between Ukraine & Russia included? <u>Do they listen attentively and</u> <u>unite themselves</u> in particular celebrations or with the prayers for peace specially in the Eucharistic prayers during the Mass?

The whole Church and we as a Faith-community prays for PEACE unceasingly and explicitly. A few examples: On the Solemnity of the Mother of God, we pray for PEACE at the beginning of each year; the Roman Canon, we pray --- We come to your, Father, with praise and thanksgiving, through Jesus Christ your Son. Through him, we ask you to accept and bless these gifts we offer you in sacrifice. We offer them for your holy catholic Church, watch over it, Lord, and guide it, grant it peace and unity throughout the world; Eucharistic Prayer III, Lord, may this sacrifice, which has made our peace with you, advance the peace and salvation of all the world; Eucharistic Prayer – Reconciliation I, Father look with love on those you have called to share in the one sacrifice of Christ. By the power of your Holy Spirit, make them one body, healed of all division; Eucharistic Prayer -Reconciliation II, Fill us with your Holy Spirit through the sharing of this meal. May he take away all that divides us. Father, make your Church throughout the world a sign of unity and an instrument of your peace.
