

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

From the PASTOR's 0779CE

Last January 10, 2023, we begin the Ordinary Time in our Liturgical Calendar. The term takes its meaning from the Latin word, ORDINALIS, referring to numbers in a series, which comes from the nominative Latin word, ORDO, meaning ROW, ORDER. To this point, we have the numbered weeks of the Ordinary Time, which as a matter of fact, represents the ordered life of the Church worship.

This Ordinary Season has two phases: the first runs from the day after the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord until Ash Wednesday; the second starts on the Monday after Pentecost Sunday until the First Sunday of Advent. In total, there are either 33 or 34 Sundays of the season.

Now, after we celebrated CHRISTMAS reflecting on the Birth of JESUS, a fulfillment of the promised of GOD to his chosen people (*Nativity-December 25*), his Incarnation willed by the Creator to be through the obedience of the Mother of Jesus, the God-Man, as attested by the Scriptures (*Mother of God - January 1*). This love of the Father has revealed to St. Paul that all people are sharers in this promise of Christ. (*Epiphany – January 8*--- the Biblical readings at Mass unfold following the life and ministry of Jesus of Nazareth, our Saviour.

This Sunday, January 15, John the Baptist testifies to **JESUS** as the Lamb of GOD who takes away the sins of the world. He will baptize His people with the Holy Spirit.

Let us prepare ourselves with true repentance for our failings and sins so that we are worthy and ready for the gifts of the Holy Spirit --- our strength and consoler.
