

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

Featured Saint of the Week

St. Agnes, Virgin and Martyr

St. Agnes (d.304) came from a noble Roman family. She was about thirteen years old when she suffered martyrdom by beheading, having resisted threats of torture. Her name is included in the Roman Canon (Eucharistic Prayer I).

<u>A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR</u>

Peace, Goodness and Health!

My dearest brothers and sisters in Christ, as we begin the Ordinary time of the liturgical year, the Church invites us to listen to God. The Church echoes the words of Mary at Cana: "Do whatever my Son tells you to do".

The first reading narrates to us the calling of the child Samuel. God calls him by his name. Eli taught the child Samuel how to listen to God speaking to Him. In the same way, the Church teaches us this Sunday how to recognize the voice of the Lord and how to listen to Him. To be able to listen to God, it is not enough to be physically silent. We have to learn to be still to be able to recognize the presence of God. Finding our sacred space amidst the noise of the city.

We can make use of the lockdown to be able to listen to God. Put all our worries in the hands of the Lord and be still with Him. Gaze on His Holy Face full of love for us. Learn to love from the source of Love Himself. And then we can say with the Psalmist: "Here I am, Lord; I come to do your will".

In the Gospel this Sunday, John present Jesus as the "Rabbi" (teacher). The teacher invites us to listen not only by "hearing" but also by "seeing": "Come and See".

The experience of Andrew impels him to announce the Good News to his brother Peter.

As followers of Christ, we have the duty to proclaim the Good News we received through "hearing" the Word and Seeing by our experience of Him. But we cannot be proclaimers of the Good News unless we ourselves listens and see. We cannot give something we don't have. We have to receive it first.

Let us be still and listen to God who speaks to us. May the world learn to be still and listen to his Creator!
