

## PASTORAL CARE

**BAPTISMS** - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

## From the PASTOR's Office

The Christmas season has ended, and we are now at ORDINARY TIME (before Lent). As we focus on the beginning of Jesus' ministry and the role of discipleship, let us remind ourselves of Pope Francis's invitations to be missionary disciples, imitators of Christ, and an evangelizing community. Each one of us plays a crucial role in this community. Together, we must take our first step, be involved and supportive, bear fruit, and rejoice.

The Pope wrote: An evangelizing community knows that the Lord has taken the initiative. he has loved us first (cf. 1 Jn 4:19), and therefore, we can move forward, boldly take the initiative, go out to others, seek those who have fallen away, stand at the crossroads and welcome the outcast. Showing endless desire to show mercy, the fruit of its own experience of the power of the Father's infinite mercy. Let us try a little harder to take the first step and to become involved. As community we get involved by word and deed in people's daily lives; it bridges distances and embraces human life, touching the suffering flesh of Christ in others. We also are supportive, standing by people at every step of the way, no matter how difficult this may prove to be. An evangelizing community is always concerned with fruit because the Lord wants her to be fruitful. It cares for the grain and does not grow impatient at the weeds. Like the sower in the Gospel, we do not grumble when he sees weeds sprouting among the grain but instead find a way to let the word take flesh in a particular situation and bear fruits of new life, however imperfect or incomplete these may appear. Finally, an evangelizing community is filled with joy; it knows how to rejoice always and celebrates every small victory as a step forward in evangelization, filling our hearts with hope and inspiration. We do all these through the beauty of the liturgy, the source of our renewed selfgiving and the foundation of our mission (cf. **EVANGELII GAUDIUM 24).** 

Let us celebrate this season, be bold, and involve ourselves in the mission.
