## Featured Saint of the Week.

St. John Neumann, Bishop (January 5) Born in Bohemia, St. John (1811-1860) felt a desire to help in the missions in the United States of America, and was ordained in New York in 1836. Entering the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer, he established parishes and parish schools. In 1852 he was consecrated Bishop of Philadelphia and prescribed the Forty Hours devotion.

### <u>A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR</u>

O come let us adore the Lord, the King of kings!

We celebrate with great solemnity the feast of Epiphany, God manifesting Himself to us. God was made visible to us because of the love and obedience of Mary to God. Her love of Jesus, her Son and redeemer perfected her love for the Church who became her children at the foot of the Cross.

Today, we are reminded of our duty to manifest God in our lives, to magnify the Lord as Mary did, but we can only magnify Him if we know Him, if we encounter Him. We can only know and encounter Him fully in the Liturgy, where Jesus fully unites Himself to us. In the liturgy, heaven and earth are joined together, sealed with the Blood of Christ. In the liturgy past, present, and future are joined and made one. The "great hour", the "fullness of time" that St. John was mentioning in his Gospel is celebrated.

As we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord, let us try to regain and re-discover again our identity as Catholic Christian. Let us not live as "generic" Christians. Let us proclaim that we are Catholics by our distinct identity.
