

### **PASTORAL CARE**

**BAPTISMS** - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

**CONFESSIONS** - By appointment only.

**MARRIAGES** - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

**SPIRITUAL COUNSELING -** By appointment.

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

### From the PASTOR's 0779CE

The Gospel reading last January 15, 2023, is about who Jesus is and the process of getting to know him more intimately. He is the LAMB OF GOD WHO TAKES AWAY THE SINS OF THE WORLD. To understand its meaning, we need to remember an important event in **Exodus 12** when God commanded the Israelites to sacrifice an <u>unblemished lamb</u>, spread its blood on their doorpost as a sign of their faith in God's warning, and separate them from the Egyptians; when the Angel of Death passed through Egypt, he would pass over the doors marked with blood (*referred to as the Passover*) without killing the firstborn males who lived within those houses.

In the New Testament (Matthew 26:19, Mark 14:16, Luke 22:13), Jesus presents himself as <u>the true lamb</u> of sacrifice --- speaking of his death on the cross. JESUS, *he who saves his people from their sins* (Matthew 1:21), we proclaimed so at every MASS: This is the Lamb of God who takes away. (John 1:29). So, our Eucharist celebrates the New Passover. The Lamb of God brings us true freedom and makes us partakers of his salvation plan. In the Eucharist, we ask to unite our sufferings, work, and prayer to those of that Christ as an offering for the salvation of the world (cf. CCC 1368).

This weekend, the readings at MASS remind us that as God's children and Jesus' disciples, we are all invited to share in His mission.

Jesus is the great Light. May our faith witnessing be a light that guides the dark paths and leads others to Him, the source of blessing and life.

May God make his face shines upon us
