

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday - 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays - 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

Reflection on the Readings at Mass

Last Sunday, we heard of the prophet Jonah preaching the Word of God to the people of Nineveh. They listened to his preaching and turned from their evil ways. **Prophets are the mouthpiece of GOD.** They interpret His will with authority and direct the People towards God's future (**FIRST READING, Deuteronomy 18:15-20**).

God calls all the baptized, you and I, to be priests, **prophets**, and kings. Pope Francis said, "Christians are called to be modernday <u>prophets who guide others to see the Holy</u> <u>Spirit at work in everyday life</u> and not be superstitious people who try to predict or control the future." "A prophet is someone who 'shows Jesus to others, who witnesses him, who helps live today and build tomorrow according to his <u>design</u>." --- Pope's Angelus at St. Peter's – July 2, 2023.

To do this, to be a prophet in our daily lives, is a challenging task. <u>The sure way to fulfill this</u> <u>duty</u> is to listen to God's words in Jesus Christ and integrate them into our lives. Also, <u>it becomes</u> <u>possible and more straightforward</u> when we all recognize that **we ought to accept each other** as the voice of GOD.

We are bearers of His message, each according to one's status and vocation, must devote ourselves to prayers and do so wherever we are, that is, in our family, in our parish community, and in another sphere of the Church and society (SECOND READING, 1 Corinthians 7: 32-35).

Our model is Jesus, who teaches with authority like no other. **He is the living Word of God**, His only begotten Son; by the power of His Word, he overcame the power of evil (**GOSPEL**, **Mark 1:21-28**). We are all invited to know and accept Jesus' authority. We must listen and see how our Savior continually inspires us through the Scripture, the actions and words of people around us, and most significantly, the Eucharist.
