

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

BEWARE OF EMAIL SCAMS FROM SOMEONE PRETENDING TO BE A PRIEST:

There has been an increase in scams involving people pretending to be a priest you know, asking for money, gift cards or other help. Please be advised that no priest will send an email to parishioners asking for money, gift cards or other services. Scams often use the priest's name but with a strange address and the message itself often does sound like the priest you know. Exercise caution. If in doubt, contact the priest using the priest's email or phone number. Please be cautious. The scams are becoming more sophisticated.

<u>Featured Saint of the Week</u> <u>St. John Bosco, Priest (January 31)</u>

John Bosco, d. 1888 at Turin; founded (1859) the Salesians, today numbering around 15, 270 religious; dedicated to educating youth; with St. Mary Mazzarello (14 May), founded the Salesian Sisters; a pioneer in vocational training; first saint in history to submit to a press interview; forty thousand people filed past his body at his death; first canonized saint in whose honor a national holiday was declared in Italy; patron of editors; known as the "Apostle of Youth."

<u>A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR</u>

Peace!

The Gospel this Sunday presents Jesus as the longawaited Messiah, He is the King which the kings of the Old Testament represent, He is the High priests on which all priesthood flows, He is the Prophets whose coming was prophesied. The Prophet to the Nations, who would build and re-create what was destroyed by sin.

Like Jeremiah and the prophets of the Old Testament, Jesus was welcomed with hostility. When his people demand signs from Him, He draws from the colorful story of their life: Elijah and Elisha who bypass many Israelites and bestows God's blessing and healing to non-Israelite who accept with great faith the prophets sent to them by God.

Jesus, by quoting these stories was highlighting that salvation is offered to all who will accept with faith God.

In the second reading Paul reminds us that prophecies will pass away when the Messiah comes. Jesus was the perfection of the prophecies, He is God made visible to us. the Love incarnated.

The readings this Sunday challenges each of us to be like Mary, who opens herself to God by her "fiat, and made her heart the Temple of God. It challenges us to let our hearts be impregnated by God, that we may also give birth to Christ with our works of charity. We are invited by the Lord for healing that we may be a channel of God's healing for others, to become a wounded healer.
