

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday – 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays – 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

WEEK ENDING COLLECTION REPORT July 8 & 9, 2023 - \$2,354. **EAVESTROUGH REPLACED!** The damaged eavestrough of the church in the area facing the courtyard has been removed and replaced last Friday, July 7, 2023 incurring a cost of **\$3,361.75**

FLAT ROOF LEAKS: The project to replace the West Upper Roof (on the side of Cody St., above St. Francis Hall) has been approved by the Diocese with a total cost of \$ 46,700.14. The work was awarded to WOLFENBURG ROOFING. In relation to these above expenses, our application for Diocesan Tax exemption was approved, covering the same amount on both the eavestrough replacements and the flat roof. Therefore, all future fundraisings of the parish held within a year from the date of approval and up to \$50,061.00 will be exempt from the diocesan tax.

-REFLECTION -15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

FIRST READING *(Isaiah 55:10-11).* The word comes gently from God, never intended to remain suspended like clouds in midair, but to soak the earth and to be drawn back toward God like plants and trees. **God's spirit is infused within human beings where it brings forth divine fruits.** The <u>efficacy of the word of God</u> recalls Isaiah 40:5, 8 *"Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together; for the mouth of the LORD has spoken. The grass withers, the flower wilts, but the word of our God stands forever."*

GOSPEL selection (Matthew 13:9, 16-17, 19-23) "Whoever has ears ought to hear." "But blessed are your eyes, because they see, and your ears, because they hear. Amen, I say to you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it; "The seed sown on the path is the one who hears the word of the kingdom without understanding it, and the evil one comes and steals away what was sown in his heart." "The seed sown on rocky ground is the one who hears the word and receives it at once with joy. But he has no root and lasts only for a time. When some tribulation or persecution comes because of the word, he immediately falls away;" "The seed sown among thorns is the one who hears the word. but then worldly anxiety and the lure of riches choke the word and it bears no fruit;" "But the seed sown on rich soil is the one who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and yields a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold."

We must think reflectively about the human application of the parable. The evil one quickly snatches away the message of God's reign from those unprepared to receive it. Also, it is the same for those who hear but cannot meet the challenges of suffering or persecution. Then there are those who accept but are distracted by secular interests.
