

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

<u>Featured Saint of the Week</u>

Saints Martha, Mary, & Lazarus (July 29)

Martha, Mary, and their brother Lazarus were evidently close friends of Jesus. He came to their home simply as a welcomed guest, rather than as one celebrating the conversion of a sinner like Zacchaeus or one unceremoniously received by a suspicious Pharisee. The sisters felt free to call on Jesus at their brother's death, even though a return to Judea at that time seemed to spell almost certain death.

In its 2021 decree on combining veneration of Mary and Lazarus with Martha, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Sacraments said, "In the household of Bethany, the Lord Jesus experienced the family spirit and friendship of Martha, Mary and Lazarus, and for this reason the Gospel of John states that he loved them. Martha generously offered him hospitality, Mary listened attentively to his words and Lazarus promptly emerged from the tomb at the command of the one who humiliated death."

<u>A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR</u>

Peace!

Today's readings continue to reveal to us Jesus as the Good Shepherd. He is the Messiah and King who cares for His people. He brings them back to the fold and He nourishes them.

In the first reading, we see Elisha looking back to Moses, the prophet who not only led Israel out of slavery but also fed God's people in the wilderness. He is faced with the same situation as we see Jesus faced in the Gospel: A crowd of hungry people with only a few barley bread. In both instances, there was the multiplication of the loaves and there were leftovers.

Witnessing the miracle, the people regard Jesus as the Prophet. But Jesus gives us more in the Gospel today. He points towards the "Bread of Life" which will nourish His people on their journey through life. He is preparing His people to understand and see the Eucharist, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass as the true nourishment of His people. He gives us His own Body and Blood to nourish us in our pilgrimage on this Earth as the source and summit of our life. Receiving our Lord Jesus in the Eucharist, we proclaim His death and resurrection and with certain hope we look forward to the resurrection moved by the commandment to love God and our neighbour until He comes again. Ave Maria!
