

# PASTORAL CARE

**BAPTISMS** - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

**CONFESSIONS** - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

### **SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -**

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

<u>VISITS TO THE SICK AND HOMEBOUND</u>: Fr. Jobe will be visiting the sick and homebound parishioners of our Parish. If you wish to avail yourself of the sacraments of Confession, Holy Communion and Anointing of the Sick, please contact Nora at the Parish Office and give your name, address and phone number. Fr. Jobe will contact you and set up a day and time that is convenient for both.

<u>MASS</u> <u>INTENTIONS:</u> Following diocesan guidelines, the maximum number of intentions at a Mass is limited to only three(3). Please contact the parish office to reserve your preferred dates (at least a week before). Requests will be handled on a "first come first served basis". Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

ALTAR SERVERS WORKSHOP: on Saturday, June 25<sup>th</sup> from 9:00am to 12:00pm. If you are interested to serve, you your parent/s must be registered or parishioner of the Assumption of the BVM Parish. If you are between 8 and 10 yrs. old, must have received your First you Communion, if older than 11 yrs. old, you must have received the Sacrament of Confirmation. Your parent/s' written consent will be required if you are under the age of 16.

Pre-register by calling Nora Horrigan at 613-276-5526 or the office at 746-8503. **REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS IN BAPTISM:** Effective immediately, they have to be Roman Catholics, Baptized, Confirmed and regularly receives the Holy Eucharist. They also have to take part in the Baptismal Preparation and a letter from their Parish Priest, confirming that they are practicing Catholics is also required.

**WORKSHOP FOR LECTORS AND EUCHARISTIC** <u>MINISTERS:</u> on Saturday, June 18<sup>th</sup> FROM 9:00am to 12:00pm for both new and existing Lectors and Eucharistic ministers. Requirements: must be a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish, at least 18 years old, must be a fully initiated Catholic, attend Mass on a regular basis and not living in a state of unrepentant sin. In addition, Lectors must be able to read carefully in the language of the Mass that they will serve. You must pre-register by calling the office and leaving a detailed message (613-746-8503).

*PRE-AUTHORIZED DEBIT*: We encourage our parishioners and donors to contribute directly from their bank account to the parish bank account with regularity and complete security. A special greeting to all our Filipino parishioners on the 124<sup>th</sup> anniversary of their Philippine Independence. Congratulations, Maligayang Bati!

Every time we make the sign of the cross, we give witness to our belief in the Most Holy Trinity. It is the way we should begin and end every prayer and, indeed, every day of our lives. I can remember in the little town where I grew up that the bus used to pass in front of our Catholic parish. We knew to make the sign of the cross and, what's more, the Protestants onboard used to wait to see if we did our duty. I can also remember when I watched sports like baseball on the television and some players would make the sign of the cross. Something inside me would react with pride and delight as I saw the players make a public profession of their faith.

Our belief in the Most Holy Trinity is confirmed by Sacred Scripture. In the first reading from Proverbs, the Wisdom of God, God's Son, was alongside God the Creator as His craftsman and He "found delight in the human race." In his letter to the Romans, St. Paul testifies that God, who is Love, has poured that love "into our hearts, through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us." In John's Gospel, Jesus confirms and assures us that the Spirit we received at baptism and confirmation will guide us to all truth. With the common work of the three divine persons at the heart of our Church, we have every reason to rejoice and give witness to the Trinity even by a simple sign of the cross.
