

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday – 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays – 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

From the Pastor's Office

We recently celebrated two Solemnities, that of the Holy Trinity (June 4) and the Body and blood of Christ (June 11). We learned that our God, who presents Himself as One and Triune, is not distant to us but is so very close that in the Eucharist, that which is the Bread of life, nourishing us as we journey on toward our eternal homeland.

This was followed by the **Solemnity of the Sacred Heart** (June 16) should remind us that the Eucharis is none other than the Heart of Jesus himself – He who loves us first and takes care of us with genuine love. Linked with the Sacred Heart is the obligatory liturgical celebration of the **Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin** (June 17) like the love of Jesus's Sacred Heart, Mary's love for His Son and for us is holy and genuine love. Jesus Christ and the Blessed Mother united in their love of all.

This weekend, in our Sunday liturgies we will meditates on the consequent truths of Faith ----We, who believe and truly follow Christ, are a priestly kingdom and a holy nation (FIRST READING). We are His people, the sheep of his pasture (RESPONSORIAL PSALM). We are reconciled to God through the death of his Son... thus we are saved by His life (SECOND READING). Jesus shares His Mission with the disciples (GOSPEL). Our mission as Christians is to continue this commission --- we are instruments in God's plan to see the lost sheep and bring all people to unity and peace.

Let us pray! "Divine Heart of Jesus, I offer you through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, Mother of the Church, in union with the Eucharistic Sacrifice, my prayers, actions, joys and sufferings of this day in reparation for sins and for the salvation of all people, in the grace of the Holy Spirit for the glory of the Heavenly Father. Amen."
