

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

Featured Saint of the Week

<u>Blessed Raymond Lull, Martyr (June 26)</u>

Raymond Lull was born in Palma in the Balearic Islands about the year 1235. Divesting himself of all worldly possessions he joined the Third Order of St. Francis. In his zeal for souls he was instrumental in founding a college to give suitable training for missionaries. Because of his writing on almost all branches of human learning he was called Enlightened Doctor. After his arrival in Bougie in Africa he suffered imprisonment and was almost stoned to death. Put on board a ship half dead he reached Majorca and died on June 29, 1315.
