

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - 15 minutes before all Weekday Masses, as well as 3:30 p.m. on Saturday; or by appointment with the priest.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - by appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

Featured Saint of the Week

St. Paulinus of Nola, Bishop (June 22)

Born of a patrician Roman family in Bordeaux, St. Paulinus (335-431) was successively prefect, senator, and consul. A pagan when he married, he converted and became a monk and later was consecrated Bishop of Nola. He gave his people not only an example of virtue but also wise guidance during the Gothic invasion.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Peace and Joy to you my dear brothers and sisters in the Lord!

After celebrating a series of beautiful Solemnities after the Pentecost, we are now on the 12th Sunday in ordinary time. Last Sunday, the Church gave honor to "Corpus Christi", the Body of Christ. The Church invites us to contemplate Christ to be able for us to be fit to be part of his mystical body, the church. As the food we eat shapes our physical body, so does the Eucharist shape our true identity patterned in the image and likeness of God and makes us part of the living Body of Christ.

The readings for the ordinary time in the liturgical cycle gives us grace, direction and hope in building the Church, His body. In the Gospel, Jesus asks us to fear no one except God, to put our trust in Him. To live our faith by acknowledging Him by word and action. Letting the fire of love from the Holy Spirit impels us to charity ("Caritas Christi urget nos!"). This will help us stand on the tripod of the Church namely: "Leitugia" (Liturgy/Eucharist), "Kerygma" (proclamation of the Word), and "Diaconia" (Charity/ Service).

The second reading reminds us that all of these are grace, therefore a gift from God, the giver of all good things. No one of us is worthy and deserving.

Let us be grateful for this gift after all the word "Eucharistia" means "Thanksgiving"

Give thanks with a grateful heart for our God is a great God!
