

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday – 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays – 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

UNDERSTANDING SUFFERING in the Book of Job

Considered by many as a thought-provoking and challenging book of the Bible, the Book of Job, *written primarily in poetic form*, offers insights about suffering and wisdom that are relevant then and even nowadays. It explores suffering and God's justice. Job, a righteous and prosperous man, is suddenly subjected to unimaginable suffering and loss. **But why do good people suffer?** What can we learn from Job? How does this narrative challenge our understanding of suffering and God's justice?

This central theme of suffering and God's justice raises questions about the nature of our existence and how we understand and relate to God. It challenges notions of divine retribution, cause and effect, and especially the idea that suffering is always a direct result of personal sin. The book gives no easy answers but does something more profound: it encourages deep reflection and a willingness to engage with life's profound questions.

In reading the story of Job, we must shift the focus from "why do good people suffer?" to "Who is our God?" Let us consider the Father's sovereignty and the mystery of divine wisdom, remembering that we are but a small part of a much larger universe and that our limited perspective cannot fully comprehend the complexities of His grand plan. This realization should inspire a sense of humility and awe in us.

God directs the world with power and might, with mercy and in love. Let us be humble and accept God's authority. Remember that understanding the reasons behind our pains and suffering will not always lead to satisfying answers. Instead, it encourages us to trust in God's faithfulness, to believe that He has a plan even in our darkest moments, and to find solace in His love and mercy.

<u>READ the Book</u>, at the end may we have deep faith to sing as in the Psalm: *"Give thanks to the Lord, his love is everlasting"* (*Psalm 107*)
