

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

<u>REQUIREMENTS</u> FOR GODPARENTS IN BAPTISM: Effective immediately, they have to be Roman Catholics, Baptized, Confirmed and regularly receives the Holy Eucharist. They also have to take part in the Baptismal Preparation and a letter from their Parish Priest, confirming that they are practicing Catholics is also required.

A MESSAGE FROM FR. JOBE

Peace and every good!

Whatever our vocation in life is, it may not always be easy to discern or commit decisively to it. Elisha is initially unsure before responding to the Lord's call through Elijah (1st reading). Even when we respond to a religious calling, a certain tension exists between bodily desires and the Spirit since we are in the world but not of the world. True freedom is gained by a vocation lived out in the Spirit (2nd reading). When following Jesus, just as He set His face for Jerusalem, our goal is the heavenly Jerusalem. Reaching that goal will require engagement and commitment on our parts while remaining open and flexible to the roadmap God draws up for us to arrive there (Gospel).

For us Franciscans, for example, our vocation is a lifetime commitment that truly makes us free in the Lord. Far from being obstacles or restrictions on life, our vows of poverty, chastity and obedience are pathways to freedom. Certainly, we live in the world and we are tempted like everyone else but we rely on God's grace and the Spirit to proclaim the joy of the Gospel. Along the way, Jesus reminds us that "the Son of Man has nowhere to lay His head." This is very much a trait of our Franciscan way of life; we are itinerants and we go where we are needed to do the Lord's work. That is why we Franciscans are transferred more often than diocesan priests, for example. Even when we move on, though, we continue to carry in our hearts, and to remember in our prayers, the good and faithful people we have served. May your own vocations be fully blessed!
