

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday – 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays – 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

FROM THE PASTOR'S OFFICE

After last week's reflection on suffering and God's justice in the Book of Job, we remember the following ---

- 1. Not every suffering is because of or the direct result of personal sin.
- 2. God's wisdom should instill in everyone a sense of awe and humility to accept His authority over us.
- 3. That we knew God as faithful, merciful, and loving, for which we ought to give thanks.

On this 13th Sunday in ORDINARY TIME, the **First Reading** (Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24) reminds us that the Father's creation is inherently good. We are to receive the divine gift of immortality if we maintain the right relationship with God and practice correct behavior toward others, emphasizing the significance of our actions.

In the **Second Reading** (2 Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13 – 15), St. Paul discusses an example of exemplary behavior toward another through <u>solidarity</u>.

St. John Paul II said: "Solidarity is not just a feeling of compassion or shallow distress at the misfortunes of so many people. On the contrary, it is <u>a firm and</u> persevering determination to commit oneself to the common good; that is to say, to the good of all and of each individual,



because we are all really responsible for all."

Let these words resonate in our hearts, reminding us of our responsibility for the common good, the importance of our correct behavior, and solidarity with others. Thus, we consider, *since solidarity results from caring and responsible love, how can we be accountable for all? Also, because each person is important, do we think and act in terms of the community and not for individual good?*



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
