

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

<u>A MESSAGE FROM FR. JOBE</u>

Peace and every good!

On Pentecost, the Gospel reminds us that the doors of the Upper Room where the disciples had met "were locked for fear of the Jews." Another well-known Scripture assures us that it is the emotion of fear before God that is the beginning of wisdom (Prov.9:10). With the outpouring of the Holy Spirit by way of tongues of fire, the disciples were able to speak the languages of the world (1st reading). Indeed, in the Church today, that same Spirit pours out a wide variety of gifts for the building up of the Body of Christ $(2^{nd} reading)$. As St. Paul reminds us, these spiritual gifts are given to the faithful in order "that we become one in faith and in the knowledge of God's Son, and form that perfect man who is Christ come to full stature" (Eph. 4: 12-13).

Since Christ is the wisdom and knowledge of God, our coming to form that perfect man demands a certain attitude before God. Our humility, if not fear before God, is a good starting point. That is not to say the Lord is unapproachable or unloving. On the contrary, God is love and ready to bestow the many gifts of His Spirit on open and reverential hearts. More importantly, the gifts of the Spirit are not granted out of any sense of favoritism or privilege but, rather, because of the open and uncomplicated disposition of the simple-hearted before God. On this Pentecost Sunday, let us repeat with the Psalmist: "Lord, send forth your Spirit, nad renew the face of the earth."
