

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

Featured Saint of the Week

St. Joachima, Religious (June 10)

Born into an aristocratic family in Barcelona, Spain, Joachima was 12 when she expressed a desire to become a Carmelite nun. But her life took an altogether different turn at 16 with her marriage to a young lawyer, Theodore de Mas. Both deeply devout, they became secular Franciscans. During their 17 years of married life they raised eight children.

The normalcy of their family life was interrupted when Napoleon invaded Spain. Joachima had to flee with the children; Theodore remained behind and died. Though Joachima re-experienced a desire to enter a religious community, she attended to her duties as a mother. At the same time, the young widow led a life of austerity and chose to wear the habit of the Third Order of St. Francis as her ordinary dress. She spent much time in prayer and visiting the sick.

Four years later, with some of her children now married and younger ones under their care, Joachima confessed her desire to a priest to join a religious order. With his encouragement, she established the Carmelite Sisters of Charity. In the midst of the fratricidal wars occurring at the time, Joachima was briefly imprisoned and later exiled to France for several years.

Sickness ultimately compelled her to resign as superior of her order. Over the next four years she slowly succumbed to paralysis, which caused her to die by inches. At her death at the age of 71 in 1854, Joachima was known and admired for her high degree of prayer, deep trust in God, and selfless charity. Joachima was beatified by Pope Pius XII in 1940, and canonized by Pope John XXIII in 1959.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Peace and joy!

We see in the Gospel for today, Jesus bringing into reality the symbol of the covenant with Moses in the book of Exodus. The covenant Jesus is giving us sheds light to the covenant God renewed again and again in the Old Testament. The Passover Jesus celebrates gives meaning to the Passover in the book of Exodus, which the Israelites would remember and celebrate each year. Today Jesus establishes his Church and gives us the Eucharist as our Passover.

In offering Himself to God through the Spirit, Jesus delivered Israel from the transgressions of the first covenant. And, as we hear in today's Epistle, by His blood He purified us and made us capable of true worship.

We continue to celebrate the "Passover of Jesus" but not the same as how the Israel of old celebrate it. We celebrate and remember it by "making present" the great hour of God's Mercy. When we celebrate the Eucharist, we enter into "KAIROS", the time of the Lord. We do not repeat the Sacrifice of Jesus but are brought to that most sacred time when Jesus offered Himself for us to reconcile us with the Father. That great event is brought to our very eyes, our time and God's time converges. Jesus commune with us and we commune with Him. Heaven and Earth unites, as a consummation of that marriage between Jesus, the Bridegroom and the Church, the Bride. The groom offers His Body and Blood for the sake of His beloved, the Church.

When we join together, as one Church in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we are made one with God, plunged in the abyss of the Mercy of God. Let us allow God to sustain and nourish us with His Love! Ave Maria!
