

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday – 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays – 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

St. Anthony of Padua is typically portrayed holding the child Jesus or a lily. There are other symbols too --- a book or bread.

In the Bible, the Song of Songs has the most references to lilies. Chapter Two begins with a dialogue between the Bridegroom and Bride, now seen as symbols for Christ and the Church. The bridegroom begins, "I am a flower of Sharon, a lily of the valley. As a lily among thorns so is beloved among my

women" (Song of Songs 2.1-2). Lilies represent purity, fragility, delicacy, and beauty.

St. Anthony was familiar with lilies and used it as a symbol of the virginal Blessed Mother and frequently mentioned lilies in his sermon notes. The following passage is typical, and addresses the core of the popular mindset linking lilies to the Mother of God. *"Lilies, the colour of milk, represent the shining white virginity of the blessed Virgin Mary. Her womb was 'set about,' fortified with humility as with a wall, 'with lilies' of inward and outward virginity" (Sermons for Sundays and Festivals; Messaggero di Sant'Antonio Editrice, Vol.I, p. 174).*

St. Anthony's Lily represents his love and devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

According to art historians, the first images of St. Anthony with lilies date back to the end of the 14th century. Enzo Pace, an Italian sociologist, writes, "The lily has been a symbol of rebirth from death and of never-ending spiritual love since ancient times. Soon after St. Anthony's death this flower was associated to his charismatic power and to the miracles brought about through his intercession."

The lily also represents his purity and his lifelong struggle against the devil.

Prayers of St. Anthony to the Virgin Mary. St. Anthony, like Saint Francis, was a passionate devotee of the Blessed Virgin. He sees her as inseparable to Jesus, her Son.

Prayer according to the Saint is this: "Prayer means to direct our affection toward God through a devout and friendly conversation with Him. It is the tranquility of a mind enlightened from on high. Prayer is also required to obtain those earthly goods necessary for this mortal life. But those who pray must ask the Lord, with an authentic Christian spirit, to subdue their will to His will: our Heavenly Father knows what we truly need on this earth. Finally, prayer is an act of thanksgiving, a recognition of benefits received, and a donation of our commitment to God so that our prayer might be everlasting."

Now, here below are two of those prayers the Saint wrote:

We praise you, Our Lady, Our hope: You, star of the sea, enlighten your children overwhelmed by this stormy sea of sin; let us reach the safe haven of forgiveness, and, grateful for your protection, may we conclude our lives with the help of the One you carried in your womb and fed by your holy breast. May honor and glory be with Him for ever and ever. **Amen**

Our Lady, Our only hope,

please enlighten our minds with the beauty of your grace, cleanse us with the whiteness of your purity, warm us with the warmth of your visit and reconcile us with your Son, so that we may deserve to reach through his help the splendor of His glory.

With the Annunciation of the Angel, he assumed his glorious flesh through you, and wanted to dwell for nine months within your womb. To him be honor and glory for ever and ever. **Amen**



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
