

## PASTORAL CARE

**BAPTISMS** - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

# 8th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The readings of the Mass point to a truth; that is, the words that come out of us make our hidden thoughts known. Sirach teaches that speaking is "the test of men" and their character. One who is upright will utter truthful and encouraging words to others. But one whose heart is cluttered with "refuse" will be exposed since the "fruit" of his mouth speaks volumes about the "tree" that produces it. Similarly, Jesus insists that a person speaks "out of the abundance of the heart (cf. Luke 6:45)." He, too, compares our speech, whether good or bad, to what grows on a tree: "For no good tree bears bad fruit, nor again does a bad tree bear good fruit."

Both readings urge us to make wholesome speech a habit. Most importantly, the Lord asks us to look inward, examine our hearts, and fill them with the "good treasure" God desires.

To develop a pure heart, we should choose to stay in good company. Avoid those the Bible identifies as *peddlers* of secrets, grumblers, and backstabbers, and try not to go along with gossip to fit into the crowd or develop the vice of meddling in other people's affairs.

HERE's a story that can help us remember -----

There's a gentleman who had a beautiful singing canary. A friend of his wanted to try to teach his sparrows to sing by keeping the canary with them. He borrowed it and placed it in the cage with his sparrows. Instead of teaching them to sing, the poor bird got so timid among the strange birds that it stopped singing and did nothing but chirp like the sparrows. The owner then took it back, but still, it would not sing. It then occurred to him to put it beside another canary, which sang well. It had the desired effect, and, regaining the old note, it sang as beautifully as ever.

Much like the canary, we ought to sing a beautiful melody that captivates the hearts of those around us and leads them to experience the profound love of God. We should not allow our voices to be dulled and stifled by the company we surround ourselves with.
