

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

<u>A MESSAGE FROM FR. JOBE</u> Pax et bonum! (Peace and all good!) is a Franciscan greeting meant to reflect the love and joy of St. Francis. Another Latin word, Laetare, in the expression Laetare Sunday, means the Sunday "to be joyful" and refers to this Fourth Sunday of Lent, also called mid-Lent Sunday. In anticipation of the joys of Easter, the Scriptures today focus on the joy of the Israelites finally arriving in the Promised Land (1st Reading), the joy of God's children reconciled by the merits of Jesus Christ (2nd Reading) and the consummate joy of the father at the return of the prodigal son (the Gospel).

Certainly, the joy of the father affords us a foretaste of the joy of our heavenly Father at our own day-to-day conversion to Him through penance and reconciliation. In preparation for Easter, let us be reconciled to the Father through the Sacrament of Confession and, then, let us truly be reconciled to each other so that we can fully experience the joy of Easter in our hearts.
