

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

Featured Saint of the Week

St. Hugh of Grenoble (April 1)

Today's saint could be a patron for those of us who feel so overwhelmed by all the problems in the world that we do not know where to begin.

Hugh, who served as a bishop in France for 52 years, had his work cut out for him from the start. Corruption seemed to loom in every direction: the buying and selling of Church offices, violations of clerical celibacy, lay control of Church property, religious indifference and/or ignorance. After serving as bishop for two years, he had his fill. He tried disappearing to a monastery, but the pope called him back to continue the work of reform.

Ironically, Hugh was reasonably effective in the role of reformer—surely because of his devotion to the Church but also because of his strong character. In conflicts between Church and state he was an unflinching defender of the Church. He fearlessly supported the papacy. He was eloquent as a preacher. He restored his own cathedral, made civic improvements in the town, and weathered a brief exile. He died in 1132. He was canonized only two years later.

<u>A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR</u>

A blessed and meaningful celebration of Holy week to all of you!

As we enter the most holy of days, let us contemplate the great love of our Lord for us and let ourselves be transformed by that love.

Holy Mother Church wants us to meditate on the Passion, Death, L Resurrection of our Lord Jesus, letting the mystery of our faith penetrate the fabric of our life to be able to bring the "Light of Christ" in the World darkened by sin.

We see a big contrast between Jesus' entrance to Jerusalem, where people acclaim Him as they shout: "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord – the King of Israel!" and when He was on the cross being ridiculed: "He saved others; he cannot save himself. Let the Christ, the King of Israel, come down from the Cross now, so that we may see and believe." There were only very few who remained loyal to Jesus.

At noon time, when Jesus, our Saviour and King, was hanging on the Cross crowned with thorns, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. When Jesus breathed His last, the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. It was a sign that by His death Jesus destroyed forever the barrier of sin that separates us from the presence of God.

Together with the centurion, may we confess with our lips and our hearts: "Truly this man was God's Son!"
