

## **PASTORAL CARE**

**BAPTISMS** - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

**CONFESSIONS** - By appointment only.

**MARRIAGES** - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

**SPIRITUAL COUNSELING -** By appointment.

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

## Featured Saint of the Week

### <u>St. John Ogilvie, Martyr (March 11)</u>

John Ogilvie's noble Scottish family was partly Catholic and partly Presbyterian. His father raised him as a Calvinist, sending him to the continent to be educated. There, John became interested in the popular debates going on between Catholic and Calvinist scholars. Confused by the arguments of Catholic scholars whom he sought out, he turned to Scripture. Two texts particularly struck him: "God wills all men to be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth," and "Come to me all you who are weary and find life burdensome, and I will refresh you."

Slowly, John came to see that the Catholic Church could embrace all kinds of people. Among these, he noted, were many martyrs. He decided to become Catholic and was received into the Church at Louvain, Belgium, in 1596 at the age of 17.

## <u>A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR</u>

## Peace, blessings, and good health!

For us to be fully reconciled with God, we must be purified.

Today's Gospel presents to us a beautiful image of Jesus cleansing the Temple. This event shows us that God does not intend to abandon the covenant he swore to Noah, Moses, and Abraham. Jesus purifies the Temple to give it a stronger foundation. He builds from the fragments of what we have destroyed by sin, He purifies it by His blood, a re-creation of the Church made into His own body by giving Himself totally to the Church as His Bride (Marriage). This sacred covenant of marriage between God (Jesus, the Bridegroom) and the Church (the Bride) was sealed by His dying on the Cross. We now understand better Jesus when He said: "Destroy this Temple and I will build it in three days.

The Eucharist is the perfect symbol of this sublime mystery. As the grain once scattered is gathered into one, crushed and pounded only to be made one again to form one bread, so we, the church, once scattered because of sin is invited from the "diaspora" to an "exodus" of return to God in Jesus, uniting ourselves to His suffering and to death and sharing in His victory over death, crowning us with the resurrection.

Every time we celebrate the Eucharist, we are reminded of this great act of love that continues to shape the hearts of those who love God. This is the great mystery of our faith that has changed the course of the world. Let us allow Jesus to transform us with the power of the Holy Spirit.
