

## PASTORAL CARE

**BAPTISMS** - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

**CONFESSIONS** - Weekdays, after the 8am Morning Mass (approach the priest) First Fridays -8:45am to 9:15am First Saturdays - 9:30am to 10:00am, 3:30pm to 4:00pm (by appointment) Every Sunday - 11:30am to 12:00Noon

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

## Q & A about ASH WEDNESDAY and the LENTEN SEASON

Since Ash Wednesday is the beginning of the entire Lenten Season, having a deeper understanding of the meaning behind the liturgical celebration, particularly about the imposition of ashes on one's forehead, is important.

**QUESTION:** Matthew 6:16 says, "And whenever you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces so as to show others that they are fasting." Why, then, do Catholics put ashes [in the form of a Cross] on their forehead on Ash Wednesday, which is a day of fasting, too? ANSWER: We Catholics use the ashes to remind ourselves of our mortality as in **Genesis 3:19.** We expressed repentance for our mortal frailty and sinfulness like **Job (cf. 42:6)** in response to God's invitation to come back to Him **(cf. Joel 2:12-13).** <u>Notice that we based this practice on the Old Testament</u>.

At the same time, the Catholic Church, in fact, highlights the same teaching of Jesus by using it as the celebration's liturgical readings.

lt's crucial to remember that Matthew 6:16 is Jesus' instruction not to outwardly display fasting their by neglecting their appearances



because some religious leaders of his time would deliberately appear disheveled when fasting to signal their piety, so washing the face was a way to counteract this outward display. The main idea is to avoid the hypocrisy of fasting just to be seen by others as devout rather than fasting with a sincere heart.

Jesus did not say not to do fasting, give alms, and pray. <u>The New Testament sanctions these things</u> <u>and stresses their importance.</u> It is equally imperative to realize that **Ash Wednesday and the entire Lenten Season are not just about fasting our other spiritual discipline** but **our necessary disposition and attitude on the day itself and during the Season of Lent**. This period is of significant importance in our spiritual growth and discipline.

Lent follows Jesus' example of spending a long period in the desert [40 days and 40 nights] and overcoming our struggles. We are called to fast to overcome our disordered attachment to physical pleasures; we are to give our all and share so that we may train ourselves to detach from unnecessary worldly possessions; we are called to increase and deepen our prayer life to strengthen ourselves against self-love.
