

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

A MESSAGE FROM FR. JOBE

Peace and all good!

Following the Resurrection, Peter and the apostles, filled with the Holy Spirit, began to witness and confess that Jesus is Lord and Messiah. They could not stop speaking in the name of Jesus even though the religious authorities had warned them not to do so (1st reading). Just as the Book of Revelation describes the angels and saints around God's throne crying loudly in praise of the Lamb that was slain, the apostles were moved by the same Spirit to give public witness to their faith (2nd reading). In the Gospel, however, the apostles were initially hesitant to acknowledge the Lord aloud even though the apostle Jesus loved declared, "It is the Lord."

In our own lives of faith, when we realize that it is the Lord who is at work blessing and accompanying us, we should not hesitate to speak openly about how God has touched and graced our lives. Especially in today's secular world, we are called to be a sign of contradiction in witnessing to the truth and that means promoting what is right and doing all we can to correct what is wrong. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (paragraph #2472) sums up our duty as committed Christian witnesses: "The duty of Christians to take part in the life of the Church impels them to act as witnesses of the Gospel and of the obligations that flow from it. This witness is a transmission of faith in words and deeds. Witness is an act of justice that establishes the truth or makes it known."
