

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday – 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays – 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

From the PASTOR's 0779CE

This Saturday, we welcome our Auxiliary Bishop, the MOST REVEREND YVAN MATHIEU, S.M. He will preside over the Celebration of the **Sacrament of Confirmation** within the Mass at 4:00 PM. This year there are 14 candidates (an adult who recently finished our RCIA Program and thirteen children from Assumption School and our parish). They were prepared by our deacon, REV. PAUL BEAUDOIN, their teachers, and the Liturgy Team --- for all their efforts in the formation preparations of the candidates up to the actual celebration today --- THANK YOU!

Regarding our reflection, remember what I shared last week? I said that our Sacramental celebrations at EASTER SEASON are fitting while we reflect at MASS our *Baptism with Christ* and the *gift of the Eucharist* from Jesus, our Lord, and Savior. Meanwhile, this weekend, Rite of Confirmation within the MASS afforded up to listen to the lesson of the readings proper to this Sacrament -- *Acts of the Apostles 2:1-6; Psalm 104; Luke 4:16-22a while* those participating in the Sunday Masses (9:30 AM, 12NOON, and 7:00 PM), the liturgical readings are *Acts of the Apostles 8:5-8, 14-17; Psalm 66:1-3a,4-5,6-7a, 16-20; 1 Peter 3:15-18; John 14:15-21.*

Both Gospel readings speak of the HOLY SPIRIT, albeit in two different contexts and timelines in the life and ministry of Jesus. Take the one in Luke --- we have the first appearance of our Lord in His public preaching at Nazareth --- He asserts that the Scripture is fulfilled as they hear it. This, together with last Sunday's teaching: "The Father dwells in me" (John 14:10), Jesus preaches the true nature of GOD and the communion of love of the Father, Him as the Son, and with the Holy Spirit. Now the other in John --- also speaks of this oneness with GOD the Father but adds a promise --- that he will give an advocate, the Spirit of Truth, who will dwell forever on those who love Jesus and keep His commandments.
