

## PASTORAL CARE

**BAPTISMS** - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

**CONFESSIONS** - By appointment only.



# <u>A MESSAGE FROM FR. JOBE</u>

# Peace and all good!

In this Sunday's Gospel, the entire law of the Gospel is contained in the "new commandment" Jesus gives us: to love one another as He has loved us. This law requires us to make a decisive choice between "the two ways", that is, the way of life or light and the way of death or darkness. In the first reading, Paul and Barnabas undoubtedly follow this rule since it is part of a first century catechism called the "Diadche" or "Teaching" of the apostles. At the same time, they acknowledge that it is necessary for them to undergo many hardships to enter the heavenly Jerusalem envisioned by John in the Book of Revelation (2<sup>nd</sup> reading).

For us, too, it is not always easy to make a decisive choice between "the two ways" that we often face in life. We struggle and have to endure many hardships to conquer, or even neutralize, the forces of death and darkness we encounter. The key for the Christian disciple is to love. We have to pray for our enemies, a healing balm that converts both us and them. We have to kill them with kindness so that any evil reaction becomes unthinkable. Again, as the Book of Revelation assures us, God Himself will always be with us as Our God to help us since He is Love. In this Way, people will know that we are His disciples.
