

# PASTORAL CARE

**BAPTISMS** - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

**CONFESSIONS** - 15 minutes before all Weekday Masses, as well as 3:30 p.m. on Saturday; or by appointment with the priest.

**MARRIAGES** - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

**SPIRITUAL COUNSELING** - by appointment.

# SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

**FUNERALS** - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

<u>Featured Saint of the Week</u>, <u>St. Christopher Magallanes, Priest, & Companions,</u>

## <u>Martyrs</u>

St. Christopher (1869-1927) was joined in martyrdom by 21 diocesan priests & 3 of the lay faithful, all members of the Cristeros movement against the anti-Catholic Mexican government during the 1920s. He spread the Gospel and ministered to the people secretly. When imprisoned, he was heard to shout from his cell: "I am innocent & I die innocent. I forgive with all my heart those responsible for my death, and I ask God that the shedding of my blood serve the peace of our divided Mexico."

## A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Peace and joy from the risen Lord!

Before His ascension into heaven, Jesus made sure we all have what we need to be able to build the Church, the family of God and to be able with the Church to return to the Father as the bride of Christ sharing in the victory of the Cross!

In the first reading, we see Philip preparing the people of Samaria by cleansing them so that the Holy Spirit may dwell in them.

The second reading reminds us that having renewed in the Holy Spirit does not mean we will not be having anymore sufferings, but those sufferings becomes meritorious because of love.

The Gospel made it even clearer when Jesus asked us to keep His commandment as a sign of our love for Him. After receiving the sacrament of Baptism, (a cleansing from the original sin) we receive the Holy Spirit through the sacrament of Confirmation. The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit enable us to follow the commandments of Jesus to Love God and neighbour as he loved us and enables us to endure the sufferings with that love. This will help us recognize Him in the Eucharist and will sustain our pilgrimage here on earth.
