

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - First Friday-(during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament), 8:30 am to 9:00 am; First Saturday – 9:30 am to 10:00 am By appointment only; Sundays – 11:30 am to 12:00 Noon, By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

From the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops

May 21, 2023 (Sunday) is designated as WORLD COMMUNICATION DAY. Today Catholics are invited to reflect upon the media of social communication (*films*, radio, television, newspapers, audiovisuals) and how this influence our lives.

The media can promote values that lead to a more fully human society. The Church's ministry is twofold. <u>The media can be used to promote the Gospel</u>. At the same time, as receivers of materials presented by the media, <u>the faithful have the duty to support and promote worthwhile presentations on media and reject those which promote values contrary to spiritual growth</u>.

This Sunday too, faithful Catholic could assist the Pastoral Works of the Pope. <u>One-third</u> of the funds collected through the designated envelopes is for what is traditionally known as Peter's Pence: donations used by the Pope for his charitable contributions to those most in need throughout the world, as well as for the support of the Holy See and its activities. in serving the Universal Church. <u>Two-thirds</u> of the Collection for the Pope's Pastoral Works is to support the Holy father in administering the Holy See and serving the Universal Church (see Canon 1271).

"Each individual Christian and every community is called to be instrument of GOD for the liberation and promotion of the poor, and for enabling them to be fully a part of the society. This demands that we be docile and attentive to the cry of the poor and come to their aid. ...The old question always returns: 'How does GOD's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help?' (1 John 3:17."
