

# PASTORAL CARE

**BAPTISMS** - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and you must attend a Baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

**CONFESSIONS** - By appointment only.



### A MESSAGE FROM FR. JOBE

## Peace and every good!

As we rejoice today at the Lord's Ascension into Heaven, our eyes remain fixed with great hope on the Lord's coming again. Our faith is confirmed by the two men (angels) in white robes: "This Jesus, who has been taken up into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven" (1st reading). In Heaven, the Father has made Jesus "head over all things for the Church, which is His body"  $(2^{nd})$ reading). Together with the apostles of the Gospel, we bless God continually in hopes of joining the body of the Church one day to its Head. In this month of May, it is only right to remember that the body of Christ attains union with its Head by way of its most fitting conduit, Mary, the Immaculate Mother of God (Ad Jesum per Mariam).

At the same time, in the Franciscan spirit, our own rising or ascension to the Father has to consider others who may need help, a generous hand, a lifting up in prayer: the poor, the outcast the marginalized in our society. On this Ascension Sunday, let us remember to reach out to include all those who may feel left behind or may not be practicing their faith. For the heavenly clouds that received Christ are infinitely wider and welcoming than one could imagine.
