

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - 15 minutes before all Weekday Masses, as well as 3:30 p.m. on Saturday; or by appointment with the priest.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - by appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

REOPENING CHURCHES: Many people are asking about this. There are discussions going on between the Archdiocese and authorities of the Province of Ontario, the reopening will be gradual and that some restrictions will remain. We will advise you in due course when the changes are finalized and further details are available.

The Parish welcomes with great joy, the appointment of His Grace, the Most Rev. Marcel Damphousse as the new Coadjutor Archbishop of the newly canonically amalgamated Ottawa-Cornwall Archdiocese. Archbishop Elect Damphousse will become Archbishop of Ottawa-Cornwall when Archbishop Prendergast retires. In addition, the Most Reverend Guy Desrochers, has been appointed Bishop of Pembroke.

<u>St. Charles Lwanga and Companions, Martyrs (June 3)</u> King Mwanga of Uganda launched persecutions of Christians in response to their opposition to his homosexual and corrupt court. St. Charles (d. 1886), the master of his pages, was martyred with fourteen other pages on June 3, 1886; many of their companions were killed later (d. 1886-1887).

<u>A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR</u>

Veni Sanctus Spiritus!

Today, the Church celebrates the coming of the Holy Spirit to the apostles and upon the BVM. We ask the Holy Spirit to come and stay in the Church and continue to purify, transform, and renew the face of the earth!

Pentecost is the last day of Easter season but this year it is also the last day of the Marian month of May. For us Catholic Christians, the end is always seen as a new beginning. What we celebrate in the liturgy is not only an event of the past but also of the present and the future. What we are celebrating in the liturgy nourishes us and transform our lives into God's image (Imago Dei) and helps us to understand better what we celebrate. May 31, in the liturgical calendar of the Church is the feast of the visitation of the BVM to St. Elizabeth. This year we celebrate both the visitation of Mary and the Holy Spirit to the Church. So beautiful for She is the Spouse of the Holy Spirit. She herself was visited by the Holy Spirit and the Holy Spirit made a dwelling in her. St. Francis salutes her with the title: "Virgin made Church".

In the Gospel, after Jesus greeted them with peace, He breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." This gesture brings us back to the creation story when God created man. Life was given to them when He breathed on their nostrils. In Pentecost, God is re-creating us but another beauty of Pentecost is that God gave us Mary as our mother. Tomorrow, the Church will honor Mary as the "Mother of the Church". Let us allow Mary to guide us so we can be formed by the Holy Spirit.
