

PASTORAL CARE

BAPTISMS - If you are a registered parishioner of Assumption Parish (or another parish) and attend Mass regularly, there is no waiting period. You may call the Parish Office to schedule a date and must attend a baptism preparation session prior to the baptism. If you belong to another parish, a letter of permission from your Pastor is required. If you are not a parishioner of any parish, you must register, attend Mass regularly, and there is a three-month waiting period before your child can be baptized.

CONFESSIONS - By appointment only.

MARRIAGES - One of the couple must be a registered member of the parish for at least 6 months and attend Mass here regularly. Please make arrangements at least six months before the wedding date. Marriage Preparation Course required.

SPIRITUAL COUNSELING - By appointment.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK & COMMUNION FOR SHUT-INS -

Anyone who wishes to receive Anointing of the Sick or Holy Communion please call the office to have your name put on the list.

FUNERALS - Arrangements should be made firstly with the church, and then with the funeral director to insure proper Christian burial.

Featured Saint of the Week

<u>St. Leopold Mandic, Priest</u>

A native of Croatia, Leopold joined the Capuchin Franciscans and was ordained several years later in spite of several health problems. He could not speak loudly enough to preach publicly. For many years he also suffered from severe arthritis, poor eyesight, and a stomach ailment.

Leopold's dream was to go to the Orthodox Christians and work for the reunion of Roman Catholicism and Orthodoxy. His health never permitted it. Leopold often renewed his vow to go to the Eastern Christians; the cause of unity was constantly in his prayers.

Leopold, who lived most of his life in Padua, died on July 30, 1942, and was canonized in 1982. In the Roman liturgy his feast is celebrated on July 30.

Peace from our Risen Saviour!

Today, the Psalmist joyfully proclaims: "The Lord has made known his victory; He has revealed his vindication in the sight of the nations."

The victory of the Cross is the victory against the ancient serpent. It is a victory of Obedience over Disobedience, a victory of Humility over Pride, a victory of Selflessness over Greed and self-centeredness.....a Victory of Love.

Like any kind of learning, it is difficult with the first and second step, but as we go on, sustained by the grace of God, it will be a lot more easier.

Brothers and sisters in Christ, the love of God put into action is the only hope we have to a better world. Love is the perfection of all God's creation for we are made in love, with love, and for love.
